



# ecoi.net search engine





- Filter by country, date, publisher, document type, etc.
- Use multiple properties per filter, choose how filters are applied
- Wildcards: homosex\*finds homosexual, homosexuality, homosexuals, etc.
- Fuzzy search: Qanuni~ finds Qanuni as well as Qanooni
- Proximity search: find 2 words within a given distance: "amnesty rebels"~15
- Bilingual COI thesaurus: automatically searches for synonyms & suggests related terms




